PREFACE

In searching through genealogical records for proof of my eligibility to become a member of the Daughters of the American Revolution, I found in the HISTORY OF THE CARLOCK FAMILY the name of my grandfather, Thomas Kimbrough, born May 2, 1805. He was the grandson of John Christian Carlock, who served in the American Revolution and in armies under General Washington for seven years. This furnished the proof needed.

I knew this Thomas to be my grandfather, not only by the date of his birth, but also by the names of his brothers and sisters. My cousins who remember him have heard him say over and over their names, shortened to one syllable. They were said in order of birth and formed a kind of jingle which goes as follows:

Bill and Ike,
John and Lige,
Sal, Brad and Duke,
Jake, Suze,
TCM, Bob and Kits.

However, the notation "nothing known about him", following my grandfather's name was a keen disappointment to me. Immediately there was born the desire to collect data about him and to make a record of his descendants. This I have done.

Special acknowledgment is given to Cousin Marion Pomeroy Carlock who has given me permission to use any part of his prodigious achievement, the HISTORY OF THE CARLOCK FAMILY AND ADVENTURES OF PIONEER AMERICANS. From it I have taken the ancestry of Thomas⁴, including his famous father, Elder Duke Kimbrough, and his mother, Eunice Carlock, both of whom were of the third generation in this country. All of Chapter I of this compilation is from his book.

Grateful acknowledgment is given also to my sister, Daisy Luginbuel, my brother, W.W. Kimbrough, and to Cousins M.B. McCarty, J.R. McCarty, Mrs. R.L. Leach, and Mrs. J. Kay Phillips for information stored in their memories; to my brother Wilson who also made available to me our father's letters, legal papers, wills he drafted for others, bills, receipts, etc.; to Mrs. C.E. Villines for records of several of her brothers' families; to Mrs. Elmore McCorkle for the Bible record of Melville Kimbrough's family, and for the lines of some of his descendants; also to all who have sent me their respective family records.

Gathering of this information has been a labor of love. Only those who have experienced the thrill and joy in doing such a task realize that many letters remain unanswered. The results are not complete, but they give a foundation from which future generations can work. It is the hope of the compiler that many will find inspiration and pride in their heritage.

Abbreviations used are: b. for born; m. for married; d. for died; dau. for daughter. A numeral to the right and slightly above a name indicates the generation in the United States.

Chapter I

THE KIMBROUGH FAMILY OF TENNESSEE

The following is an unfinished sketch of the Kimbrough family of Tennessee, written by Bradley Kimbrough, an older brother of Thomas:

John Kimbrough, from whom all the Kimbroughs in the United States have descended, came to America from England when quite a youth -- about 21 years old -- and settled in Virginia. He was an industrious, energetic and substantial farmer and reared an industrious family of boys. Though he moved here from England he was of Irish descent, hence the "ugh" was always used by the old families. The Irish spelling should be kept up. "Kim" is Scotch and means "sent", and "brough" is Irish and means "forever", so that Kimbrough means "sent forever".

The family in this country has become numerous and I can only refer to those who are my near relatives. I first mention my grandfather, Bradley Kimbrough, a son of John Kimbrough, who was born in Virginia and moved to Rowan County, North Carolina, when he was quite young and remained there as long as he lived. He married Sarah Thompson of South Carolina, of the family of Thompsons who now live in South Carolina. His occupation was farming. They raised six children: Jesse, Thomas, Duke, Amelia, Anna and David. His history is that of a successful farmer, a kind husband and father, good to his servants but would be obeyed by them without repeating his commands, yet they loved him and visited his children after his death as if they had been relatives. He and his wife were born Episcopalians but joined the Baptist Church.

Jesse, the oldest son, was a very substantial farmer, not surpassed by any in his part of the country. He lived and died in Tennessee. His son Thomas lived in Kentucky and was a successful business man and was somewhat ambitious for political honors. David, the youngest son, was raised a pet and of course was never much account. It was said he was never known to have the soles of his shoes muddy.

Duke Kimbrough, my father, moved from North Carolina to Tennessee when about 21 years old, where he married Mary Gentry, a daughter of Robert Gentry who lived east of Dandridge on the French Broad River on a fine river bottom farm known as the Robert Gentry Farm. He gave to his son-in-law, Duke Kimbrough, a farm near Dandridge where he lived for some time, then moved to Mossy Creek Iron Works where he lived a long life and was buried there. He married three times. His first wife lived to become the mother of a daughter and died. They named their daughter Mary, who grew up and married William Chilton. His second wife was Susan Hunter, daughter of Isaac Hunter of Washington County, Tennessee. She was the mother of four sons -- William, Isaac, John and Elisha. After her death he married Eunice Carlock, who lived southeast of Dandridge, Jefferson County. She was the mother of nine children, six sons and three daughters: Jesse, Bradley, Duke, Jacob, Thomas, Robert, Sarah, Susan, and Catherine. She lived 86 years and was buried

by the side of her husband. She was rather a timid woman but very affectionate. Affectionate to her husband almost to a fault, tender and affectionate to her children and step-children. When in health she was never idle. When her husband was gone preaching she did not only attend to her indoor business but saw that his directions of the business of the farm were carried out. It was said of her that she and her sons sustained a preacher. She died in full assurance of the faith and rejoicing in the love of Christ Jesus. Her works and labors of love will follow her.

In his Sketches of Tennessee's Pioneer Baptist Preachers, published in 1919, the Reverend J. J. Burnett states that the Kimbroughs are a numerous and noted family. William, oldest son of Reverend Duke, became the father of the widely known Dr. I. B. Kimbrough, formerly of Tennessee, later of Texas. Isaac, the second son, also became a useful preacher. Two younger sons, Bradley and Robert G., became distinguished Baptist preachers.

Duke Kimbrough was for 50 years pastor of the Dandridge Baptist Church, Jefferson County, Tenn. On a tombstone in the old family graveyard, near Jefferson City, Tenn., is this inscription: "Sacred to the memory of Reverend Duke Kimbrough: born Nov. 19, 1762; died Sept. 21, 1849, aged 86 years, 10 months, 2 days."

Chapter II

THOMAS AND HIS FAMILY

Thomas⁴ Kimbrough was born in Jefferson County, Tennessee; grew to manhood on his father's farm; was a farmer all his life; a Democrat in politics; and, a Baptist.

At the time of his birth, May 2, 1805, Thomas Jefferson had just started his second term of office as President of the United States. The Louisiana Purchase from France in 1803 included a state in which Thomas would later live. He was nearly four years old when Abraham Lincoln was born, and seven years old when the War of 1812 was being fought.

After reaching manhood, Thomas was married to Elizabeth Austell, a sister of General Alfred Austell of Alabama. She also was born in Jefferson County, Dec. 13, 1810. To this union were born the following children:

It is not known just when Thomas came to Arkansas. His first daughter, Sallie, had come with her husband before or at the beginning of the War between the States. Felix came in 1867, two years after the war. Thomas and the younger members of the family must have come at the same time. William did not come until many years later. Most likely, he was left in charge of the farm in Tennessee.

The trip was made, supposedly, by boat via the Mississippi and the Arkansas Rivers as far as Fort Smith. On the trek northward from there they followed, no doubt, the old road now known as Highway 59. They landed at or near Greensburg close to Old Vineyard, where they found the McClatcheys, old friends of the family.

A little later the Kimbroughs moved to Boonesboro, or Cane Hill as it is now called. Felix, and perhaps some of the other children, at-

tended the College there. It was at Cane Hill where the mother, Elizabeth, died and was buried in 1874. Several years later her remains were moved to the cemetery at Dutch Mills.

The property acquired by the family at Dutch Mills was a farm of approximately 200 acres along the west bank of Baron Fork Creek. To supplement the family income, Felix and Eunice taught school, one of the places being Vineyard, a Baptist Church near Evansville, Arkansas.

While teaching in Texas, Felix married Elizabeth Whitaker who died two years later, in 1875. Robert also had lost his first wife, whose name was Elizabeth, too. At this time the three men, Thomas and his sons, Felix and Robert, were widowers, and each had lost an Elizabeth. After Felix was married again to another Texas girl, his father and brother were eager for him to return to Dutch Mills. They felt the need of a woman to grace the home. Thomas lived with Felix and Henrietta on the home place by the creek until his death, May 12, 1886, aged 81 years and 10 days.

During those years the family had membership in the Baptist Church at Vineyard. The long drive in a wagon to services meant rising early on Sunday mornings. In the early 1880's the members who lived near Dutch Mills built a church of their own there, and brought their membership to it. Thomas, however, did not live to enjoy worshipping there long, for he died about the time the church was finished. His body was laid to rest in the cemetery west of the new church. The remains of his wife were then brought from Cane Hill and placed beside him.

Chapter III

THOMAS' SONS AND DAUGHTERS

FIFTH GENERATION

Little is known of the early life of Thomas' sons and daughters except that they lived on the farm in Jefferson County, Tennessee. They were brought up strictly and in the Baptist faith.

William was a Captain in the Confederate Army — Company A, 21st Georgia Volunteers. He did not come to Arkansas with his parents after the war, but remained in Tennessee, where, presumably, he took care of the family property. His children were born in Charleston, Bradley County, Tenn. His wife died Feb. 9, 1897, in Chattanooga, Tenn. A few years later he came with his second wife to Dutch Mills, Ark., where they lived the remainder of their lives. They are buried in the Dutch Mills Cemetery.

SARAH PHIDELIA KIMBROUGH⁵ (daughter of Thomas⁴, Duke³, Bradley², John¹) b. East Tennessee, July 16, 1835; m. Timothy McCarty, Aug. 25, 1859; d. Mar. 7, 1918, at Dutch Mills, Ark. Timothy, son of Benjamin Vanpelt and Sallie (George) McCarty, was b. Nov. 25, 1830, in Walker valley, near Charleston, Tenn. His mother died when he was an infant, and his step-mother, Olivia Gillsland, reared him.

Sally and Timothy McCarty were married in 1859 near Charleston, Tenn. They went to Arkansas to live. It was there that their first child, Thomas Alfred, was born in 1861. During the time Timothy was away at war, Sallie and her young son lived near Dutch Mills, Ark. When the war was over she joined her husband in Texas. Their second son, Benjamin, was born there. The rest of their children were born at their home place on Baron Fork Creek, a mile east of Dutch Mills.

Timothy died in 1886 leaving Sallie with a house full of children ranging in age from 24 to 5 years. She lived 32 years a widow, and died Mar. 7, 1918. The children married and left the home, gradually. About the time the youngest son, Robert, married, at the turn of the century, Ben returned, bringing his little daughter, Ruth, with him. He had lost his wife and two children. Ruth became the idol of the family. It was she who listened avidly to the stories her grandmother told of the past.

Some of those stories were about the visits Sallie made, while a girl, to her Uncle Alfred Austell's home in Alabama before the war. On such occasions an entirely new wardrobe was provided for her by her well-to-do uncle. It was from this generous supply that later, in Arkansas, a trousseau was made for her sister, Jennie.

Jane, called Jennie, and Rufus R. Seay were married at Cane Hill. His parents had come from Tennessee to Van Buren, Ark., in 1829, and later to Cane Hill. He was born in Washington County, the oldest of

eight children. During the war he served as a trooper and as a blacksmith. In 1880, he and his family moved to Dutch Mills, where he became owner of a store, half of the mill, and 240 acres of land. He was a Democrat and a Mason. Jennie was a member of the Baptist Church.

FELIX GRUNDY KIMBROUGH⁵ (son of Thomas⁴, Duke³, Bradley², John¹) b. Nov. 5, 1842, Jefferson County, East Tennessee; son of Thomas and Elizabeth (Austell) Kimbrough; m. 1. Felix "grew to manhood on the farm. In November, 1861, he enlisted in Company H, First Tennessee Cavalry, Confederate Army, and served three and one-half years. He participated in the battle of Bean Station, and was twelve months around Petersburg and Richmond. At the former place, 100 of his regiment attempted to take their lost picket line against a brigade. He surrendered at Appomatox, having passed through the war without being wounded or taken prisoner. He then returned to Tennessee, farmed until 1867, and then removed to Washington County, Arkansas, where he educated himself at Cane Hill College."

At college, 1867-1868, he studied under Major Earle. He made his way by working part of the time as clerk in a store. His address was Evansville, Ark., during the years 1869-1871. Presumably it was then that he taught school at Vineyard, a church near Evansville.

Felix went to Texas a year or more later, and continued teaching there. In possession of his heirs is a receipt dated July 1, 1876, stating that he was paid \$35 for 35 pupils for ten days at ten cents. This was at Rusk, Cherokee County, Texas.

In 1874 he married Elizabeth Whitaker, who bore him one child, Elizabeth Ada. The following year his wife died, May 5, 1875. In September 1876 he married Henrietta Baxter. They remained in Texas until February 1878, when they moved to Dutch Mills, Ark. Her father died in Texas a month later.

In that year Felix began merchandising with V. S. English and another who withdrew in 1884. By 1882 he had accumulated enough to purchase the interest of the other heirs to his father's estate at Dutch Mills. John P. Grisham was the Justice of the Peace before whom the deed was acknowledged to him by his sisters, Sallie, Jennie and Eunice, and their husbands, and his brother Robert. He had homesteaded about forty acres, and now he owned approximately 230 acres of land.

Felix was one of a group who withdrew from the Vineyard Baptist Church in 1883 and organized at Dutch Mills the Liberty Baptist Church which he served as Clerk, Treasurer, and Deacon until his death in 1905. He served also as superintendent of the Sunday School and as a teacher for a number of years. Late in life he joined the Masonic Fraternity. During leisure time at the store he studied the Bible much, and wrote several articles on his doctrinal beliefs and on Church History.

The store was located on the east side of the street. There were other stores, one on each side of the street, a blacksmith shop, and to the southeast by the stream there was a mill. This and other mills had been built by some Dutch people who fled when the war came. Thus the term, Dutch Mills, became the name of the settlement. In those days there were trees in the street, a walnut and an elm, under which farmers hitched their teams when they came to town.

The church built on the hill was also used for school purposes until the 1940's. All of Felix' children, except Betty, attended school there, and were sent afterwards to Fayetteville for one or more years of education.

Following the death of the infant daughter, Henrietta died, Sept. 5, 1896. Two weeks later the son James died. Three deaths in as many weeks was a great sorrow for Felix and family.

Elizabeth Hodges was Felix' third wife. Before their son, Felix Albert, was five years old, Felix died, Sept. 14, 1905. The following year Elizabeth and the four youngest children moved to Fayetteville where the latter went to school for two years.

Felix' home was the lodging place for preachers, salesmen, and occasional travelers.

After his death, the oldest son, Wilson, was appointed administrator of the estate, which he sold in Chancery Court and distributed the proceeds among the heirs. Some used the money to start their homes, and the others for an education.
