Individual note:

Was a soldier, merchant and farmer. Lived initially in Halifax, NS and later in Preston, NS. He was Episcopal. Served in the Royal British Artillery. In 1753 listed as a mattross, and in 1761 as a bombardier. He was perhaps in the battle of Louisburg when it was taken from the French in 1749.
