

Descendants of Johann George Goldman

Generation No. 1

1. JOHANN GEORGE³ GOLDMAN (CONRAD², CONRAD¹) was born Bet. 1712 - 1722 in Schoharie Valley, New York *Probably in the refuge camp., and died Aft. 1830 in Knox County, Indiana *Age 108. He married (1) MARTIN. He married (2) UNKNOWN Abt. 1750 in Tulephocken, Berks County, Pennsylvania.

Notes for JOHANN GEORGE GOLDMAN:

According to Mrs Leroy Sanders - Berks County Historical Society of Pennsylvania Johan George Goldman settled in the Tulpehocken region in 1728. Rev. Richards wrote: "There were constant accessions to the number of the first feeble band in 1723. By 1728, other families left Schoharie, and settled (in Tulpehocken). She also stated that in the same book is a list of the members of the German Reformed Church were Conrad Goldman, Jr. was a member between 1735 and 1755.

Johann George Goldman was a member of the congregation that laid the cornerstone of the Evangelical Lutheran "Christ Church" on May 12, 1743 according to the Historical Society Womelsdorf, PA.

*Johann George Goldman appears on the membership lists of the Evangelical Lutheran Church - 1743 -46 Tulpehocken, Pennsylvania. The first settlers in Tulpehocken were Lutherans and German reformed. Tobias Wagoner was the first pastor of the Lutheran congregation. (See Rupp's History of Berks County, PA.)

Notes on The Meaning of Tulpehocken: Sources: Dick Creps, Judy Thayer, and Dave Becker Tulpehocken...which means "Land where the turtle sang and wooed" ...also the name of a Creek in Eastern Berks County.

The Swatara, a tributary of the Susquehanna, led to the Tulpehocken Creek, which "fed" into Lancaster Co. Now, a distinct area of research within Berks and Lancaster Counties, and into an even larger area. When the Palatinates went to New York, and got fed up with the British attitudes toward them, Weiser, and others began to look for other better places to settle. Apparently, Wm. Penn's folks had contacted them, offering land in the western part of Pennsylvania. Seemingly, the ulterior motive for the Penns was to provide themselves (in Eastern Penn) with a westerly buffer against the Indians. The PA authorities didn't throw down so many roadblocks against German Settlement, as did the British (who allowed only 10 acres per family and was not sufficient for adequate farming). The story of the Palatinates migration is mythical. SEE: Earl W. Ibach's "Map".

Conrad Weiser (father and son) knew about the Tulpehocken area of Berks County through numerous contacts with the Indian peoples of that area, and trips made to the region. It is unknown how long the negotiations took, but the decision was finally made to make the move to the Tulpehocken area. A petition exists which names those original migrants. This migration took place in 1723, when 33 families left New York upon the invitation of Governor William Keith of Penn. And settled in the Tulpehocken area. The following petition to Governor Keith from these Palatinates who would eventually settle along the Tulpehocken Creek in Eastern Berks County. "To his excellency, William Keith, Baronet, Governor of Pennsylvania...The Honorable Council...The petition to us, the subscribers, being thirty-three families in number, at present inhabiting Tulephocken Creek, Humbly Sheweth that your petitioners being natives of Germany about 15 years ago were by the great goodness and royal bounty of her late Majesty, Queen Anne, relieved from the hardships which they then suffered in Europe, and were transported into the colony of new York, where they settled. But the families increasing, being in that Government confined to the scanty allowance of ten acres of land to each family were on they could not well subsist. Your petitioners being informed of the kind reception which their countrymen usually meet with in the Province of Pennsylvania, and hoping they might, with what substance they had, acquire larger settlements in that Province, did last year (in the Spring of 1723) leave their settlements in that Province, and came with their families into this Province, where upon their arrival they applied themselves to his excellency the Governor, who, of his great goodness, permitted them to inhabit upon Tulpahaca Creek, on condition that they should make full satisfaction to the proprietor of his agents for such lands as should be allotted to them, when they were ready to receive the same. And now, your petitioners, understanding that some gentlemen, agents of the proprietor, have ample power to dispose of lands in this province. An we, your petitioners, being willing and ready to purchase do, humbly beseech your Excellency and Council to recommend us to the favorable usage of the proprietors agents, that upon paying the usual prices for lands at such distance from Philadelphia, we may have sufficient rights and titles made to us for such lands as we shall have occasion to buy, that our children may have some settlement to depend on hereafter, and

that by your authority we may be freed from the demands of the Indians of that part of the country, who pretend a right thereto. And we humbly beg leave to inform your Excellency and Council, that there are fifty families more who, if they may be admitted upon the same conditions, are desirous to come and settle with us. We hope for your favorable answer to this our humble request, and as in duty bound shall ever pray. JOHANNES YANS, JOHANNES CLAES SHAVER, PETER RITT, JO. This next section deals with the long journey from New York to Pennsylvania, which these original settlers made: "Guided by the Indians, and not under the leadership of either the elder Weiser, or his gifted son, as some suppose, both of whom came later, the pioneers of 1723, with much toil and labor, cut their way through the forest, after which, with their wives, little ones, and animals, they followed, by day, the scanty track they had made in the woods and slept at the foot of it's trees, wooed to slumber by it's ceaseless noises, during the night, until the forty or fifty miles, which separated them from the (Susquehanna) river had been traversed. Then came the building and launching of heavy rafts, to contain their domestic utensils, and of the light and speedy canoes for themselves, on which they were to continue their long journey to the haven of rest, accompanied slowly by their cattle, driven along the river's banks. As forest and open space, trees, rocks, and sandy beach, succeeded in each other, with tiresome monotony, and as camp-fire at the close of day, they little reckoned that they had swept by the spots where the flourishing towns of Binghamton and Oswega were, later, to stand. As they rounded the curve where the Lackawanna joins the Susquehanna at Pittston, who was the wizard of their number whose divining rod would point to the priceless diamonds beneath them and tell them that their dumb animals were treading underfoot riches of far greater value to mankind than all the pears and rubies for which the world was striving? Whose fancy amongst them all would have pictured or imagined the beautiful city of Wilkes-Barre, and the cola breakers everywhere rearing their heads into the air as though they were indeed giants issuing from their long slumber in the bowels of the earth? As they exchanged greetings with the Indians, in their village of Shamokin, can it be that there rose up before any one of them a picture of the hideous scenes of their near future, or any foresight of their murdered sons, and daughters and the blackened ruins of the homes towards which they were hastening, or did the troubled dreams of any other reveal to him the fort at Sunbury, no longer Shamokin, filled with it's soldiers, and sound into his astonished ears the booming to it's guns? Down the Grand Stream, which was bearing them, they slowly floated until their watchful eyes caught sight of a long log cabin on its shores, where now stands the capitol city of Pennsylvania, (Harrisburg) and as they looked upon the home of John Harris, it is altogether probable they saw, for the first time in all their journey, the dwelling of a white man. Cheered by the sight on they went, until they came to where the Swatara Creek joined it's waters with those of its mighty brother, and at the spot where Middletown now stands, our wanderers at last changed course and entered the stream which told them they were drawing near the goal towards which they had been hastening for so many weary days. To reach this goal, was to endure a few more hardships and trials, and when, in the lovely Tulpehocken (which means "land where the turtle sang and wooed.") region, nestling at the foot of the Blue Mountains and wavered by its numerous streams, they pitched their camp for the last time, it was HOME. Outside of the surrounding Indian villages, we have no record of previous settlements, so that, in very truth, they had taken up "vacant lands." Thus is the connection of the Tulpehocken Settlement with the region of Schoharie, New York.

Later in the same paper, Rev. Richards wrote: "There were constant accessions to the number of the first feeble band. In 1728, other families left Schoharie, and settled (in Tulpehocken), amongst whom were: Leonard Anspach Caspar Hohn George Schmidt George Zeh Johannes Noecker Johann Jacob Holsteiner Michael Lauer Anreas Kapp Jacob Werner Johann Philip Schneider Jacob Katterman Jacob Lowengut Heinrich Six Philip Theis Conrad Scharf And in an even later work, Rev. Richards writes: "Before the erection of Berks County, in 1752, the township of Tulpehocken was a recognized division, being a part of Lancaster County in 1729. Because of its great size, in 1734, another township was laid off from it and erected, called "Heidelberg" to commemorate that part of the fatherland from whence many of the settlers came. The early inhabitants, therefore, of the old Townships of Heidelberg and Tulpehocken, were composed, mainly (though not entirely) of the immigrants from New York Province. Rupp names the following as amongst the first settlers: John Adam Diffebach, Peter Lebo, Christian Lower, Jacob Fisher, Peter Ansbach, John Soller, Michael Reid, Jacob Sorbet, Herman Walborn, Francis Wenrich, Frederick Reed, Ulrich Schwartz. Evidence or residence in North Carolina

Old Rowan County, 1753.

Notes: from Sandy Speight

Peter Goldman is at the beginning of the south fork of the CRANE river 2 miles south of the granite quarry. That is the quarry that I told you about and George and Martin had land south of there. This means that this Peter Goldman is a son and grandson of our George and Martin. He must of inherited this land because I can't find the sale to Peter in my records. Daniel Boones house is 20 miles North, Northwest of Peters between Hunting and Dutchman's Creek (this would of been Davie County after 1836). John Goldman had land more west than this. But then again he sales 121 acres of land in October 1800 to Lemuel Saunders on the shore of Anderson creek and A CORNER OF "THE FURNACE" LAND. Peter Goldman inherited land for his father or grandfather George, or Martin. And we now know where our Goldmans had land in North Carolina. Squire Boone owned land west of Daniel on the other side of Bear River no more than ten miles away. He got it by a Granville grant. I don't know when he sold it but 200 hundred acres changed hands in 1784.

1768 - Rowan County Tax List of John Ford shows "Martin Goldman".

1771 - John Goldman (First Chain bearer) Tyron County original land survey index. Note: "A chain bearer is considered significant because such a person is therefore known to have been present at a certain location on a given day. Sometimes an individual will appear as a chain bearer but in no other public record of that time and place. The waterway's were indexed because it is frequently useful to know other landowner's in a given area." Katherine Sullivan - Dellinger researcher.

January 14, 1785 John Keeler to Christian Reinhart (sic): for 60E NC money sold 300 ac. in Lincoln formerly Tyron Co. on both sides of Hoyles Creek of south fork of Catawba River: granted May 15, 1772 to John Keeler. Signed John Keller & Jerusha's mark. Witness: Robert Blackburn and MARTIN GOLDMAN. Rec. July 1786 Book 3 p. 73; Book 14 p. 50.

Martin Goolman "George Martin Goldman Sr." ? ("Goolman" is the spelling that many of the Goldman's used in Indiana.)

1790 Lincoln County Court* January:

ORDERED by the court that WILLIAM KING bring to our next court the son of his wife and orphan boy that now lives with him in order that he be bound out as the law directs. Issued.

Note: William King was married Hannah (Dellinger?) Goldman on September 17, 1789. Hannah already had the two children also named Goldman and they are not listed as bastards; therefore, this Hannah may have been "Hannah Dellinger" daughter of Jacob Dellinger of Lincoln County, NC. who also lived on Leeper's Creek.

ORDERED by the court that John Goldman (b. 1776) be bound unto Peter Hoyl until he arrived to the age of twenty one years being now thirteen years nine months old. Said Hoyl to learn said boy the weaving trade and to give him all the respects according to law.

ORDERED by the court that Hannah Goldman (b. 1782) be bound unto Boston Buff until she arrived at the age of eighteen years. She being now seven years old, he to give her all things agreeable to law.

Lincoln County Land Entries 1785 - 1795 #811 granted. GEORGE GOLDMAN claimed 50 acres on water's of Leeper's Creek: boarders George Dellinger, Jacob Dellinger, and William Dellinger entered February 17, 1794.

April Court 1797 - Deed of sale from Daniel Asbury to JOHN GOLDMAN for 120 acres dated July 16, 1796 Proved by John Parr.

January Court 1799 - Ordered by the court that Alexander Lorance, David Lorance, Basel Dorsey, Mathew Wilson, Peter Justice, Isaac Lorance, Sr., George Reel, David Abernethy, Jr., Frederick Link, JOHN GOLDMAN, Beal Bishop, Mathew Goodson, George Dellinger Jr., Jones Bradshaw & David Reel be a jury to lay off a

February 9, 1805 William Dellinger (Lincoln Co.) to MARTIN GOLDMAN JR. and GEORGE GOLDMAN (same); for 30 silver dollars sold 137 ac on the water's of Leeper's Creek; boarder; Jacob Dellinger and William Dellinger. (signed) William Dellinger's mark, witness: John Derr jurat and George Reel. Rec. April 1805 Book 22 p, 322.

923. November 12, 1805 GEORGE GOLDMAN (Lincoln Co.) to Jacob Link (same); for 19 silver dollars sold 36 ac. on the water's of Leeper's Creek; boarder his own land, George Dellinger, & Jacob Dellinger; granted June 30, 1797 to GEORGE GOLDMAN (signed) George Goldman witness John Derr jurat and Andrew Stockinger (or Mockinger), Rec. April 1806, Book 21 p.

924. November 12, 1805 GEORGE GOLDMAN and MARTIN GOLDMAN JR. (Lincoln Co.) to Jacob Link (same); for 81 silver dollars sold 37 ac. on the water's of Leeper's Creek; boarder Jacob Dellinger and William Dellinger. (Signed) Martin Goldman (sic) and George Goldman; witness: John Derr jurat and Andrew Stockinger (or Mockinger), (sic). Rec. April 1806, Book 21 p. 553.

172. July 27, 1807 William Dellinger (Lincoln County) to Jacob Link (same); for \$400. sold 359 acres on the water's of Leeper's Creek; boarder: an old corner on Little Creek, John Tarr, land George and Martin Goldman sold to said Link & 60 Acre tract; being (a) 60 acres granted Sept. 28, 1798 to William Dellinger, (b) part of 400 granted March 2, 1775 to Jacob and William Dellinger, & (c) part of a grant 1752 to Martin Dellinger who sold to Phillip Dellinger who sold to Henry Dellinger who sold to Jacob Dellinger who sold to William Dellinger (signed) William Dellinger's mark; witnessed: J. Graham, Abram Drupley, & GEORGE GOLDMAN jurat. Rec. October 1807, Book 23 p. 251.

By 1810 George and Martin, and John Goldman are in Jefferson County, Kentucky.

526. October 9, 1810 - JACOB DELLINGER (Lincoln Co.) to MARTIN GOLDMAN, (JEFFERSON COUNTY, KY): 7 sliver dollars sold 7.5 acres; boarder: his own land. Signed Jacob Dellinger's mark. Witness: Adam Hoopes & Henry Link. Rec. October 1810 Book 4 page 162: Book 401. 10" 203.

Note: Katherine Sullivan (researcher in Charlotte, North Carolina) thinks that "Big Jacob Dellinger" may be doing this for his grandchildren. "Hannah Dellinger" may must have ben married to a Goldman man first. Her Goldman children (John and Hannah)are not listed in the bastardy records. This research continues on the Dellinger/Goldman links.

Note: William Dellinger (possibly Hannah Dellinger "Goldman" King's brother) also went to Knox County, Indiana as well as John Helderman and Adam Like -(were in Indiana by 1817), and Louis Reel was in Indiana by 1802 as well as the Myer's. All of them were neighbors on Leeper's Creek in Lincoln Co., North Carolina. Like's son's were David, John, Elias, Jacob, and Moses. The Wehunt's, Like's, Dellinger's, and Link's all have family associations. (Jacob Goldman married Catherine Wehunt, Martin Goldman Jr. married Sally Link, and Sarah Goldman married Jacob Like). The Likes go back to Virginia.

The Goldman's were landowners, but never were called for jury duty. This suggests a religious rejection of the necessity to swear an oath when serving on a jury. The court "did" respect those religious beliefs. In Knox County, Indiana the Dellinger's and Goldman's were both Lutheran.

According to researcher Elaine Rowland, George Goldman was living with his son Martin Sr. when he died at 108 in Knox County, Indiana in 1820.

2. MARTIN4 GOLDMAN, SR (JOHANN GEORGE3, CONRAD2, CONRAD1) was born Abt. 1732. He married (1) ANNA MARGARET SCHMID March 19, 1754 in Host Ref. Church - Marion Twp. Berks Co., Tupehocken, PA by H. W. Stoy, daughter of GEORGE SCHMIDT. He married (2) BARBARA KELLER Abt. 1774.

Notes for MARTIN GOLDMAN, SR:

Martin Goldman Jr., born 1775 in Ky, died between 1850-60 Crawford co., Indiana. Martin Jr. m Sarah "Sally" Link on 7 January 1805 in Lincoln Co., NC. They had 10 children. Their son, Henry Goldman, born January 1819 in Knox Co., Indiana, m. 29 Nov 1842, Knox co., Indiana, Margaret Thacker, da of Abel Thacker (son of Benjamin and Anna Grubbs of Goochland Co., Va.) and Anna Lu Baldwin (da of Joseph Baldwin and Martha Glendennin). Henry m. (2) 8 Nov 1866, Elizabeth Mason.

George Goldman, Martin Goldman Sr. and Martin Jr., sold their land in Lincoln Co., NC in 1805 to Jacob Link, and they all moved to Jefferson Co., Ky. where they are listed in the 1810 census. Then between 1810 and 1820 they moved to Knox co., Indiana, near Vincennes.

The 1800 census of Lincoln Co., NC., there are the following Goldman men:

- Henry, born 1750-60, page 842.
- Martin, born 1750-60, page 855.
- John, born 1760-70, page 855.

George Goldman was not in the 1800 Lincoln co., NC census but he sold his land there in 1805 so he may have been missed on the census.

George Goldman died at 108 years old between 1830-40. In 1830 he was living with Martin Goldman Sr. He was put on a road crew in Knox Co., Indiana, when he was over 100 years old - so he either was in good shape or the road supervisor didn't know him at all.

In 1820 Knox Co. Ind. census: p 91: George and Martin Sr. are listed.

In 1820 Crawford Co.,Ind.census, p 8: John Goldman and John Goldman Jr. are listed.

In 1830 Knox co.,Ind. census, p 249: Martin Goldman Jr. and Samuel Goldman are listed, and George was in Martin Sr.'s HH.

Current research is back to mid 1700's in Penn & NC. Other Spellings include: Weigand, Weigandt, Weighandt etc. While absolute proof of the immigrant ancestor of the Wehunt/Weehunt/Weahunt families has eluded a bevy of researchers for almost 25 years, we are convinced that our families with these various spellings are descended from immigrants from the villages of Friensheim and Fridlesheim in the Palatinate district of Germany. Both villages lie near the town of Mannheim. The Wehunt version of the name is just one of many that emerged from the period. Other variations include Wehon, Weighant, Weighandt, Went, Wieand, Wigandt, Wion, Wyant. All of the present day Wehunt/Weehunt & Weahunt families are believed descended from Frederick Weighant as this partial excerpt for Rita Wehunt Black's book on the Wehunt family "They Didn't Blow In on the Wind" illustrates. In the years immediately following the Revolutionary War in America, sometime between 1783 and 1786, Frederick Wehunt and his wife, Catherine, left Pennsylvania and followed the mountain slopes through the Shenandoah Valley, where they may have stopped over for a year or two in Virginia or Maryland. Their destination was the Yadkin Valley, known as the Black Country by the earliest settlers there. The Yadkin was a fertile valley and in August of 1787 they settled in Rowan county, North Carolina, a county with a large German population. In August of 1787 Frederick Wehunt and his wife bought one hundred and forty-nine acres on Elisha Creek for sixty pounds from Randel Alexander..... There in Rowan County in a home on Elisha Creek, Frederick and Catherine Wehunt would live together for fourteen years. Frederick was a farmer. He and his wife were members of Heidelberg Evangelical Lutheran Church (Old Dutch Meeting House) located on the east side of Dutchman's Creek..... In the old leather bound Heidelberg Church record book kept in the Mocksville, N.C. Library, North Carolina Collection, is the baptismal record of Frederick and Catherine's son, Michael, written in beautiful German script--Michael Weighant, born April 18, 1793; baptized May 1794; parents: Frederick Weighant and wife, Catherina..... In April of 1800 Frederick Wehunt made his will leaving all his worldly possessions to his wife, Catherine. Shortly afterwards, Frederick Wehunt died in Rowan County and is buried there in an unknown grave, most likely at Old Heidelberg Cemetery.. In September of 1804 Frederick's widow, Catherine sold the 149 acres on Elisha Creek to John Chesheur for 150 pounds. The children of Frederick and Catherina Wehunt (Weighant): A. William Wehunt: Born in 1781 in Pennsylvania, he married Fanny Lingerfelt April 4, 1815 in Lincoln County, N.C. . He lived on Potts Creek . In the early 1840's he moved to Lumpkin county, Georgia. He was still living there in 1860. B. Catherine Wehunt: Born around 1785. She married Jacob Goldman in Lincoln County March 2, 1808. Her marriage bond was signed by her brother, William. Little else is known about her. C. Mary Wehunt: Born around 1790 in Rowan County, North Carolina. She married Solomon Wright December 8, 1818. She lived in Burke County, N.C. near her mother and brother Michael, until the 1840's when she migrated to Lumpkin County, Georgia. She was still living there in 1860. D. Michael Wehunt: Born April 18, 1793 in Rowan county, North Carolina. His wife's name was Marguerite Lowman (Larman) and was probably from Burke County, North Carolina . They lived there until the early 1840's when they migrated to Lumpkin County Georgia. Michael was living in Lumpkin County in 1850 with his mother-in-law Lucy Lowman (Larman). Marguerite probably having died after 1840. Michael would marry Elizabeth Montgomery on October 29, 1867 and would move to the Sugar Creek district of Fannin County Georgia with several of his children.

Family consisted of John Link, age 34, Margaret Link, age 36, John Link Jr. , age 10, Caty (Catherine) Link, age 10, Molly (Polly) Link , age 8 and Sarah Link, age 6.
- A John Link married Mary Fulbright then later married her sister, Margaret Fulbright Crites. I think Mary is buried here in Lincoln County, NC and Margaret is buried with John in Missouri. I have him as the son of John Adam who is the son of Hans Adam. My source on this has not proven to be the most reliable. Everything that I sought to confirm when I first got the info(about ten years ago)checked out great. Mostly what I was able to confirm was in Missouri, but I also had the opportunity to confirm some info as far back as 1762 while I was visiting in PA. In the last year or so, with online access I have found some of the information to be wrong, and I am systematically verifying everything now. I will email you with a full generation report. John Link estate file (box 47, file 905) from the microfilm. His wife at the time of his death WAS Margaret, although I could not confirm her maiden surname. His children were: Daniel Link, John Link, Aaron Link, Elizabeth Miller (wife of John L.?), Margaret Mayfield (wife of Stephen), Catherine Helderman (deceased before her father, wife of John), Mary Helderman (wife of Conrad), and Lavina Link (later married Hosea Welty). I would like to transcribe this entire file over the next few weeks, so if anyone wants a copy as an attached file, just let me know.
- Tryon and Lincoln Co., NC court records confirm that John Link was a son of Jacob and Barbara Link. These records were abstracted by Brent Holcomb, and are available in many larger genealogical libraries. There is so much incorrect information out on this family that you had just as well trust ONLY primary sources. The Hans Adam story is from my uncle's book, "The Eddleman-Fulbright Families". This man did exist, but there is no evidence he was part of this Link family. The will of Mary and Margaret Fulbright's father, Johann Wilhelm (William) Fulbright, mentions Mary Link and Margaret Crites. I have yet to see the evidence that Margaret married John Link, although I am told it exists. In any event, nearly all of John Link's children were born prior to the 1805 date of William Fulbright's will, so Mary would have been their mother. Might I also ask where you got the middle initial "A" for John Link? All the records I have only mention him as John Link.
- Katherine Link INKS that married Peter Jump in 1790 Kentucky. Mary Katherine Link b. Feb 1 1727/28-which could possibly be her mother or grandmother.
- Frederick Link who was born in Lincoln County, NC <1770. He married Catherine ??? and moved to Burke County, NC. Frederick's known siblings are Henry (died in Lincoln County, NC in 1864 with no will), Catherine (married Adam Hoppes, Jr.), and Elizabeth (married George Hodson Triplett). Moyers / Mayers / Myers who married

a Jacob Link and was living in Lincoln Co. NC about 1770. Her parents were Elias Moyers (1735?-1802)& Elizabeth ?. Her brothers were Elias Myers, Jr. (1760-1833), John Myers (1762-1822), & Frederick Myers (1770-1839).

My family line goes through John Jacob Link's son John Adam Link. There is a lot of information in the book on Phillip.

- HOWEVER, the old account of the Battle of Ramsauer's Mill written by Wallace Reinhardt quite a few years ago and quoted by historian Alfred Nixon was later corrected by Mr. Nixon. From there he took a boat down the Ohio to Limestone (Maysville, Kentucky) and then went overland to his sister's house 4 miles north of Shelbyville. Enoch more than likely met Elia "Lucy" Goldman there in Berks County. She was age 17 and he was 16. Squire and Jane returned to Shelby County in 1794 and they may have persuaded some of the Goldman men to go with them to Kentucky.
- Enoch served in Bland Ballard's Militia company at age 17.
- After his marriage he bought "Wells Station", 3 miles north of Shelbyville where they lived for two years. He leased the station to Joseph Byran and moved to his father's new station on Fox Creek where Squire had a warrant for 300 acres. They lived there until they went to Indiana in 1804.
- Squire left Kentucky in 1802. He visited Daniel Missouri and started building a house there, but Enoch came and persuaded him to come back home. He thought of the "Grassy Valley" on Buck Creek he had seen in Harrison County, Indiana. So they decided to go there.
- Enoch received a Captain's commission from Gov. Harrison and served in the Militia in 1805. He was engaged in flat bottom boating on the Ohio and the Mississippi Rivers - to New Orleans - from 1810-1827. Edward Goldman was a likely crew member when he saw the town of Natches, Mississippi.
- When they got to New Orleans the boats were sold for lumber and they returned horseback to Natches.

I would assume if that were the case and she chose to stay with the second husband there would be a divorce proceeding somewhere.

Johnny Edna (Bacon) (Willingham) Kelly, my Great Grandmother, whom I call Grandmama and shall refer to her as , herein. Grandmama was born in 1920 in the City of Clovis, New Mexico. Her mothers name was Ona Kindness (Goldman) Bacon. Ona was born October 20,1901. Grandmama's father's name was John Adosia Bacon, born June 20,1897. Both of Grandmama's parents were born in Evansville, Arkansas. Her parents grew up together in the same area and they attended the same schools.

John and Ona Bacon were married December 19,1917. They had four daughters. Grandmama was the oldest Of their daughters. In the following order after Grandmama was her sister Mary Belle (Bacon) Wesson, whom is called and shall be referred to as Belle. Belle was born October 2,1924. Ruth Adosia (Bacon) Sanders was born October 10,1927. The youngest sister's name is Betty Faye (Bacon) Jones. Betty was born April 22,1930.

While speaking with Grandmama, she shared with me her earliest childhood memory which was at the age of four years old. This was the age she recalled her sister Belle was born. Her dad worked on the railroad. Sadly, during her age of just four years old she became a very sick little girl. Because of her illness her parents felt it best that she live with her grandparents on their ranch. The ranch was located near the Pecos River in De Baca County, New Mexico. Grandmama recalled the smell of the food, so vividly, of when she had first arrived at her grandparents ranch. This was probably due to the strict diet the doctor had put her on. Her diet consisted of crackers and buttermilk. This was all the food she was able to keep down. Grandmama remembered that she did have a piece of watermelon. This piece of watermelon caused her mother to get very upset because her mother just knew that the piece of watermelon could have killed her.

In the 1920's Grandmama's grandparents owned several sections of land where their ranch was located. After a few months of living with her grandparent son their ranch, her parents leased a house from her dad's parents and moved about a mile away from the main ranch. The section of land her parents leased, she recalled, was reasonably priced and referred to as the School Section. The house had just two rooms and had what was called then, a dugout. Half of the house was considered normal, but where the kitchen began it was simply dug into the earth. The purpose of this was to keep the house cooler.

During Grandmama's early years her family was considered to be well to do. Grandmama's grandparents owned their ranch, and owned Bacon General Store. They also owned the Post Office. To have money in the bank and savings as her grandparents in Taiban, New Mexico also, was considered very good.

Grandmama's grandpa lost several thousands of dollars in 1926 in the Taiban Bank. That same year he also became very ill and passed away a very short time later. Before he passed away he had sold the general store and the post office. He set that money aside for his children. Grandmama's parents moved into the main ranch house with her grandmother.

School was always a favorite place for Grandmama. She enjoyed reading books. She loved to learn, so very much. She recalled her and her sister

riding a horse to school because it was too far to walk alone. When the school teacher lived with them at times, the teacher would walk with them to school. When the teacher was not living with them and they were supposed to ride their horse to school, most often they would still have to walk alone. What would happen, alone the way to school their cousins would take their horse away from them and leave them to walk alone.

At the age of seven years old, Grandmama said she received her first store bought item. Her dad had bought her and her sisters a coat when he was in Fort Worth, Texas. He was in Fort Worth, Texas because he was selling a load of cattle. Grandmama said, " I will never forget my store-bought coat. The coat was plaid with brown, and red, and tan colors". Her father also brought home with him from this cattle selling trip a new 1927 Model A car.

Grandmama's mother was a mid-wife to many woman around the area where they lived. Most woman never saw a doctor before, during, or after child birth. If a mother did not have enough breast milk to feed their infants they would feed them horses milk. They believed that horses milk was better for an infant than cows milk. A mother would use any kind of bottle they could find to use to feed their child. A nipple would be made for the bottle by sewing an inner tube over it.

Most people did not see a doctor, even if they were dying. Home remedies and medicines were used. Some basic necessities were coal oil, turpentine, greases, kerosene, cloverine salve, quinine and black draw tea. (All remedies except the salve and tea was for sore throats and croup, the salve was used for burns cuts and scrape, quinine was used for malaria and chills. The tea was used for constipation.)

In 1930 Grandmama's dad decided to sell his part of the ranch and move to a farm in Floyd, New Mexico. This was a big adjustment for Grandmama. Grandmama had been use to a one room school house that combined kindergarten through eighth grades. The school had about fifteen kids in all. Attending Floyd School now, there were about thirty five students in her class alone.

Grandmama began telling me a story about Christmas time one year. How she had really wanted a doll. No one in her family had toys. Grandmama remembered the closest thing she ever had as a toy to her was a pet lizard. She had this lizard for several weeks. Christmas was celebrated around the community Christmas tree. All of the towns people would join in on the festivities. The tree was decorated with colorful little dolls and were later given out to the children. She recalled when there were only two dolls left on the tree, she prayed that her two sisters would get them, but that did not happen. Grandmama's father did not believe that children should have Christmas or receive presents, she said.

When Grandmama was fifteen years old she started dating Rollie Guy Willingham. He was twenty five years old. There dates consisted of only attending church on Sundays, and that was it. Grandmama's dad did not like the age difference and so he told her to stop seeing him and he would take to church instead. Her dad knew she loved to go to church and did not want her to walk alone. She and her father went together, but it only lasted about a month. So she began to see Rollie Guy Willingham again. Her dad became furious at her and said she could not see him anymore. Grandmama said, she did not say another word about it.

Rollie Guy Willingham, called and known as Guy, but to me he was Grandad and I shall refer to him as Grandad herein. Grandad and Grandmama became married on February 9,1935. Grandmama's family was un ware of them getting married, only one block from where they were standing in the court house. Just being fifteen years old, my grandmother told the clerk a different story in order to get their marriage license. After they got married, they immediately caught a train out of town Ad spent the night on this train. The following morning they caught another train returning home the next day.

Grandmama's dad was very furious when he had found out that she and Grandad had married. He went to the clerks office to verify what he had heard. Two years later their first child was born. John Thomas Willingham was born in Portales, New Mexico. That same year, he was born, the crops were so bad The cotton had to be left in the field for the cattle to be turned in on it.

In 1938 many people everywhere had to let their fields go and move to town. Grandad had to move his family into Portales, New Mexico. In that same year Nancy Ann (Willingham) Stidham was born. Two years later Barbara Joyce (Willingham) Charlton was born. In 1941, this same year, Grandad started working for the railroad. The family had to move again. They moved to Clovis, New Mexico.

In 1945 my grandparents had their fourth child. Linda Sue (Willingham) Page. Grandmama said that was about all they had, four children when they moved to Brawley, California to work in the fields. Grandad had a heat stroke, and after only six months in Brawley, they moved to Truth or Consequences, New Mexico. Two more children were born. Charles Wayne Willingham was born in 1950 and David Lee Willingham was born in 1952. They then decided to give California another try and moved back to Brawley. Grandad worked in the cotton fields and was in charge of a crew.

Grandmama also helped out in the fields whenever she was needed.

Grandad went into the Hay Contraction business in the year of 1954. He also built and began a church, know as the Full Gospel Church still today, in Brawley. Grandmama ran a bailer to help them conserve money and good help was unreliable. In 1955 Margaret Carol (Willingham) Parks was born. Two years later passed, their eighth and final child was born, Janice Kay (Willingham) Luallin.

In 1972 Grandad sold his hay contracting business to his son-in-law, Carl Stidham. Carl is married to his eldest daughter, Nancy Ann. Grandad passed away while he was preaching his Sunday evening sermon. This was a very devastating time not only for the family but for the church also. Tom Charlton, the husband of his daughter Barbara Charlton, then assistant pastor became the pastor, and continues to pastor the Full Gospel today. Grandmama kept herself busy raising her children. She wrote and still writes today beautiful poems, and short stories. She writes tons of letters and loves to talk to anyone about the Lord. She always makes quilts, Afghans, pot holders, and so many pretty hand made items.

In 1986 Grandmama married pastor, Ray Kelly. Grandmama has know Ray for thirty-eight years through his evangelistic ministry. They both live in Brawley and have lots of love in their hearts of gold.

- Aunt Linnie is our wild woman of the family because she ran a nudist colony at Evansville. I think that this was after Pres died. She pushed the limits on everything. It took the Arkansas State Legislature to close her nudist colony down. Once she needed more water for the camp and no one would help her so she through a stick of dynamite down the well and knocked out water all over the mountain. I think that she had several husbands in her lifetime and was a very wealthy woman. It is said that she had money in every bank around northwest Arkansas and owned loads of real estate around Fort Smith and Lincoln, AR.
- When St Elmo's body was brought back after he was killed in WWII she pried open the casket to make sure it was him.
- Preston's wife, Lowrence O'Keefe, refused to allow Linnie to bury him at Evansville at the Academy Cemetery even though the headstone says that he's buried there. He's buried at the National Cemetery at Fayetteville, Arkansas
- Linnie died just 8 weeks before her 104th birthday. She had suffered two strokes and was unable to speak above a whisper or swallow. Her daughter, Lelah, said that she only weighed 54 lbs the day she died and was very literally skin and bone. I saw her the week before she died and she smiled at me with what appeared to be recognition.

Notes for ST. ELMO DUNN:

- At the age of 19 Elmo died when his plane was shot down over the English Channel. As a part of the 8th Air Force he was the top ball-turret gunner in a B17 (Flying Fortress). He was returning to England from a bombing mission over Germany. His rank was that of a Staff Sergeant, and he won the "Purple Heart" from the English Air Corps. 28,000 such gunners were killed during the war. there missions were considered suicide missions. Any airman that completed 25 missions were sent home.
- His remains were sent home in a sealed casket and his mother, Linnie, pried it open to "make sure" it was in fact her son. He is buried at the Academy Cemetery in Evansville, Arkansas very near his parents Linnie Goldman and Preston Dunn.

Notes for CHARLES TOLBERT (CHAD) GOLDMAN:

- Grandpa Chad was a tall, blue eyed, gray headed older man before I ever knew him. I've since found out that he enlisted in the Army during WWI and was in Little Rock training when there was a large TB outbreak and he came down with the illness. The army sent him to Hot Springs to recover. That's about the time that he met and married Ruby Forsyth in Hot Springs. After Grandma Ruby passed away with cancer, he married Alta Epperson, who was waitressing in a restaurant near Evansville, Arkansas. She had children and grandchildren of her own in Oklahoma City. The grandson died in a car wreck. She also had a granddaughter that would visit some in the summer month's.
- Chad had a substantial farm with a dairy and for a period of time he owned and operated a grocery store in Evansville, Arkansas. He had also sold cars in Stilwell with the Carson's and sold some real estate in the area. His best friend was suppose to be Buck Eads from over around Bell in Stilwell, OK.
- He was a member of the Masonic Lodge in Cane Hill, Arkansas.
- Grandpa Chad died with emphysema in the Veteran's Hospital in Fayetteville, Arkansas and is buried beside his first wife, Ruby "Forsyth" Goldman in the Academy Cemetery in Evansville.

Notes for RUBY JANE FORSYTH:

- According to the Buckner Orphanage records: The Forsyth girls were placed in the orphanage in Dallas, Texas after the death of her father James B. Forsyth in November 1905. Ruby would only have been 5 years old at the time. Her mother, Belle Clark Forsyth (in very poor health with heart and kidney problems) was on March 2, 1906 advised by the Baptist minister named J.M. Mizzell in Naples, Texas that the Buckner Orphanage was a place that could care for the children. On April 20, 1906 the final application papers were completed and sent to Dallas along with the statement of Dr J.M. Walls as to the physical condition of Belle Forsyth dated April 19, 1906. (NOTE: The letterhead on the doctor's statement says that "Walls and Smith" were druggists "not doctors".) Someone in Naples other than Belle took Clara, Myrtle, Ruby, and Maybelle to Dallas and turned them over to the founder and general manager - R. C. Buckner on May 4, 1906. Apparently the founder of the orphanage was not there much of the time, but he was out soliciting funds (charity) to keep the orphanage open.
- It didn't take long for Belle to miss the girls very much and she wrote to the Buckner Baptist Orphanage on May 8, 1906 appealing for work at the home so that she might be nearer the girls. She reiterated in her letter that she was not attempting to interfere in the workings of the orphanage, but that the children were her "last treasures" in life. She wanted to be near unless one of them became ill.
- Belle stated in another letter on July 9th that if she could just be near the children she and her baby Opal could stop grieving so about the girls. She said she was poor and had to work no matter where she was living. It didn't matter whether she was in Dallas or Naples.
- Buckner wrote back on July 23, 1906 that she could come and stay for a week and they would see if there might be some way that she could do some light work for her keep and become part of the "family" there. Clara, who would have been in the fourth grade at this time, had written to her mother pleading that she come and work in the sewing room at the orphanage so she could see the way they were being treated. On July 29th Belle sent another letter that stated she was quickly making preparations to come to Dallas and be with the girls at the orphanage.
- When Belle got to Dallas she stayed only 3 days and left according to a note written on her letter in the file. The next letter that came dated on August 26, 1906 and to the attention of Buckner stated that she was coming back to take her girls out because they were not being properly cared for and that it was a mess at the orphanage. In her pitiful letter she assured Buckner that if he didn't want everyone to know what was going on in that home that he'd better let the children go back with her. She threatened to go to the law and to sue him if necessary. She gave Buckner 10 days to get her children cured of all disease.
- Evidently, it made Minister Mizzell anxious and he wrote to the founder of the home on September 4, 1906 saying, "No one will take seriously the slanderous words of this widow," but that they should just let her have the girls back because she was their mother. He felt that because people "like to talk" that some would make much of her complaint. He added that he was sorry he had ever involved himself in the affair. The "blank" forms were completed and Mizzell saw to it that money was provided for the train fare to and from Dallas. He did however suggest that there would be a representative to investigate the home to clear up any disputes. Mizzell was planning to leave Naples for a new position in New Boston and invited Buckner to come and solicit funds for the home there.
- Clara's eyes were so infected that she would crawl under her bed because the light hurt her so badly. She said the children didn't have regular meals and were told to "pray" for their food. They were covered with lice. Belle came on the train and took the girls out of the home without incident on September 6, 1906. She left Dallas on the same day. One of the girls had such bad sores on her legs that her stockings had to be soaked off after they got back to Naples.
- The Buckner Orphanage is still in existence today, but it's called the Buckner Baptist Benevolences and is under the administration of Norman L. Lockett. R.C. Cambell is the President. Mr. Lockett was very helpful in providing our family with the documentation of all correspondence and records in their files in

- After Belle had placed Ruby in two different orphanages in Texas and Arkansas, she farmed her out to a family named "Mineer who lived in or near Hot Springs where she became a companion to their retarded son. Her sisters all went to other families. I don't know how much connection they had with each other at this time.
- Those who knew Ruby said that, "There never was a better woman." According to Linnie's daughter, she was a "city girl" and had to learn everything about being a farm wife from scratch including cooking. She was a very small built woman with tiny feet (size 4), brown hair with red highlight's, and brown eyes.

- Josephine Goldman was a teacher in Montana and taught Chet Hutley, the News Anchor, in a one room school in Saco, Montana. Josephine wrote "Golden Reflection's Of By-Gone Days" which was dedicated to her children Bill, Jo Ann, and Nell; her grandchildren; and to her husband, McKee Anderson. The book was printed by H.J. Quality Printing Tumwater, Washington and copyright in 1973.
- Josephine spent her early years in the little town of Eckerty, Indiana. She was only 9 when her father Moses Martin Goldman died. His last word's to her were, "Be a good girl and meet Daddy in Heaven." The family soon migrated to Montana to homestead and left Josephine to fight her own battles. She bid farewell to many of her friends who left in the American Expeditionary force under General Pershing to participate in World War I. After witnessing the horrors of the war she found her own son Jack, one of the first to leave for WWII. In her book she depicts the depression days and the homestead life in the Badlands of Montana. Her later years were spent in the state of Washington where she enjoyed hard work and contentment.
- Josephine said, that when her father, Moses Martin Goldman died she would think about the poem written by the Indiana poet "James Witcomb Riely" that follows:

HE IS NOT DEAD

- *I can not say and will not say*
- *That he is dead. He is just away*
- *With a cheery smile, and a wave of the hand.*
- *He has wandered into an unknown land*
- *and left us dreaming how very fair*
- *It needs must be, since he linger's there,*
- *And you - oh you, who the wildest yearn*

- *for an old-time step, and the glad return,*
 - *Think of him foreign on, as dear*
 - *in the love of There as the love of Here.*
 - *Think of him still as the same I say,*
 - *He is not dead - he is just away.*
- Before her father's death Josephine tells of a fairly normal childhood even describing the wooded area around them and the fact that she and her best friend caught a squirrel "Foxy" for a pet. She told of going to Sunday School in Taswell and a host of family member's in Eckerty, Indiana. She said that her mother, Arabell made lots of apple butter and worked very hard, but also admits that her mother always had a desire to go to new places. Owensville, Indiana provided an opportunity for her to attend high school and go to the Prom. She would know the joys of graduation and carry a dozen red roses to mark the significance of that accomplishment. Soon her mother would be sending her a train ticket to Montana and once again she'd have to leave all that she knew to be familiar and comforting.
- There was land for the taking in Montana, but there were also the cruel winter's and isolation that would be very difficult for her young, adult children. James would bring his wife with him to Montana. (Josephine doesn't mention this woman's name but does indicate that it was someone he met back in Indiana-Arabell said they'd both have to live with her because she couldn't set up two household's.) Arabell's tight gripe on her children would later cause James Goldman to move to Vancouver, Washington and start a dairy that did prove to be a successful venture for him. He lost his wife in childbirth and was attempting to raise Jimmie and Myrtle alone when he also died. George may also have been married but she doesn't name a wife for him in her book. She does mention a nephew named Paul Goldman twice and stated that he died in Italy during WWII. This must have been George's son because we know that James only had the two children. Josephine said that Arabell had Always been in a habit of meddling in her children's business which caused problems on occasion.
- Josephine Goldman met McKee Anderson at the "Turkey Track" dance in Saco and from that night on McKee began his pursuit of her until they married. He was the one who found her the teaching position at the Huntley School where she taught Huntley's son Chet and had dinner with his family on many occasions. She also had a homestead connected to McKee's property. McKee was having a difficult time bringing in a crop and had to work away from home allot in the beginning of the marriage. Josephine didn't teach school after she began to have children. They stayed on the homestead and she told of some of the worst winter's conceivable. Josephine, like her mother, was a very capable woman. But what her mother lacked in sensitivity, Josephine tried to make up for with her own children. Her life appeared to be full of endings and beginnings.
