



**Ellen Mae Beal**

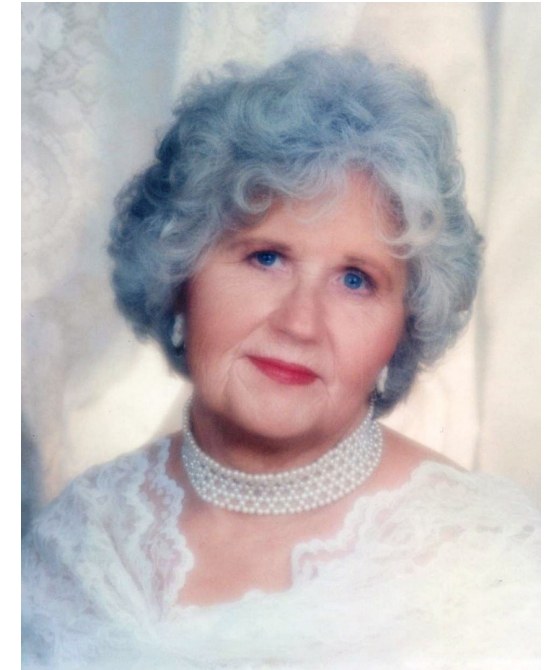
