

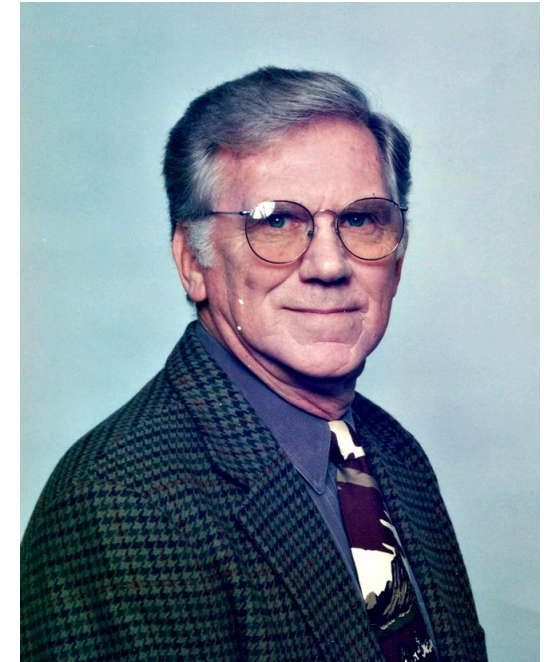
Leonard Riley Frederick
