

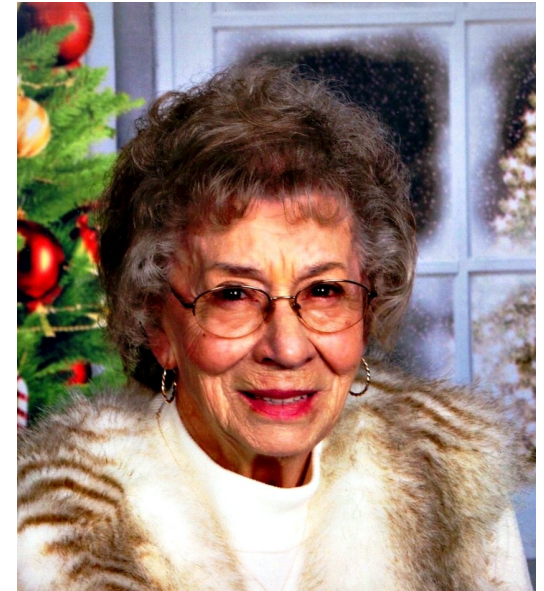
Sue Heisler
