

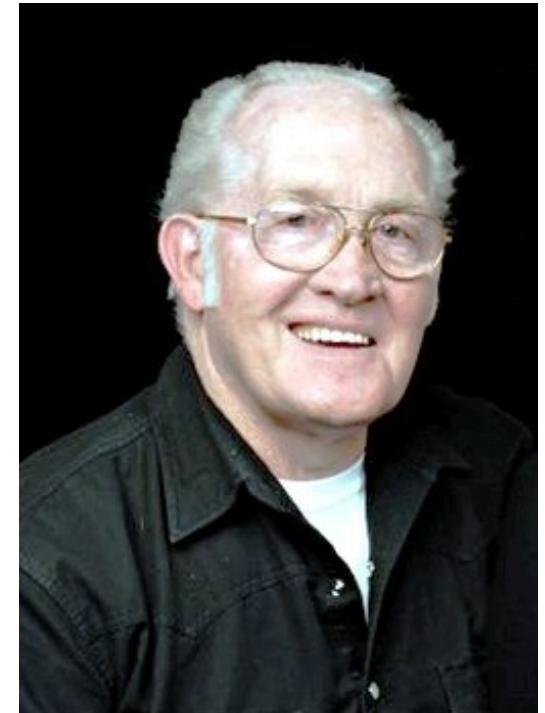
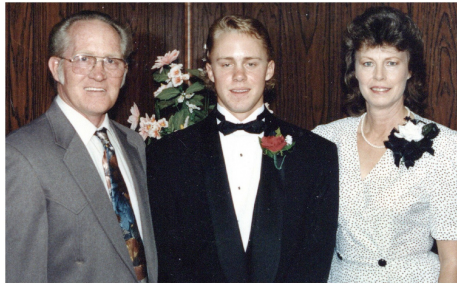
### **Wesley Glynn Pinkerton**
