

Our loss is God's gain with the passing of Robert Anthony Seward, 68, in Stillwell, OK on April 8, 2022.

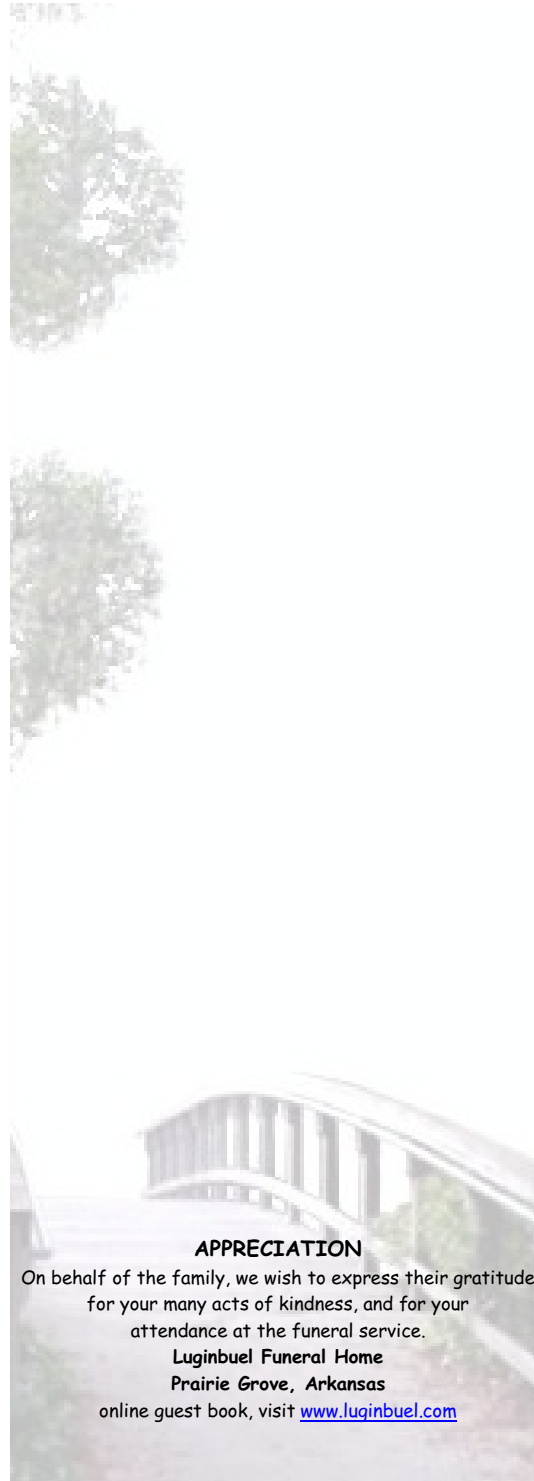
