He installed the first computer feed system in the state of Arkansas and was named the #1 dairy farmer by Purina Feeds, and raised turkeys for Cargill while doing all that. As a retired Vietnam Veteran racing horses was another great hobby, where he trained quarter horses that broke track records in Sallisaw, Oklahoma City, OK and Kansas City, KS. Jerry had many wonderful friends throughout his life that cared for him deeply, and he cherished every moment that he had with all of them.
