BEATY CEMETERY AT CINCINNATI, ARKANSAS

RECORDED MARCH 7, 1969 BY CINCINNATI E.H.C.

This small, family cemetery is located on land once owned by the early Beaty's in this area. The land is now owned by H.L. Gilbreath. The Beaty's settled there when they came into this sparsely settled area, probably around 1829. Thomas Beaty was in the Washington County Census of that year. As most of the early settlers did, he made his living from the land. He was from Clinton County Kentucky, and married Nancy Odle. They reared 7 children, 5 boys and 2 girls. Thomas died at the young age of 45 years. These families were prominent in early Cincinnati history.

BRADY CEMETERY

Located west, just off Ark. 59 highway, on the Washington County and Benton County line road near the Bryant's home, this cemetery is all but lost. There are many sandstone markers and three graves with large rocks bordering them. I found 23 identifiable graves scattered about. There was a small, fenced center plot with the following burials:
