After almost two centuries, the cemetery is the final resting place for more than 500 residents, including early pioneers, as well as soldiers and veterans from the Revolutionary War, Civil War, and other conflicts.

Listed in the National Register of Historic Places, the cemetery's earliest marked grave dates to 1836, the same year Arkansas became a state.

Still a burial ground for area residents, the cemetery attracts visitors from many locations to trace their ancestors, reflect on the pastoral setting, and discover the names of those who helped shape Cane Hill and Washington County.

#### **CEMETERY GENERAL REGULATIONS**

\*Please place flowers in vases or secure on headstones to allow for mowing and maintenance. Exceptions may be made during, and two weeks following, Memorial Day weekend and other recognized holidays. The cemetery board reserves the right to remove glassware, boxes, cans, pots, toys, temporary flower containers, dead flowers or any other object that may be unsightly or interfere with the cutting of the grass.

\*No trees, shrubs, nor plants are to be planted on any lot or grave.

\*No lot nor parcel shall be defined by fence, railing, coping or enclosures, excepting those parcels so enclosed at the time of the cemetery's acceptance to the National Register of Historic Places.

\*No more than one (1) upright or flat grave marker may be placed at the head of any grave space and no more than one (1) flat marker may be placed at the foot of any grave space. Plot boundary markers should be flush with the ground at each of the four corners.
