

Farmers Convert Cave Into Palace.

One of the most prominent and successful farmers of Prairie Grove, Arkansas, who is an active member of the National Farmer's Union, has dwelt in a cave for years. It is probably the most palatial cave in the world, and is fitted up with all modern conveniences, including hot and cold water, electric fans, electric light and steam heat. He discovered the cave at the top of a mountain 1,700 feet high. It is seventy-eight feet long by twenty-five wide and thirty-two feet high. The walls are of beautiful granite, which has been handsomely polished. The ceiling is forty feet thick. The front of the cave is glass, which the owner and occupant, H. S. Mobley, put in, together with hardwood floors. The flues for the cooking range passes out through the mouth of the cave and extend upward a distance of nearly forty feet. Movable screens permit the increase and reduction of rooms at the pleasure of the occupants. A fine spring at the top of the mountain furnishes water through a private system of water-works.
