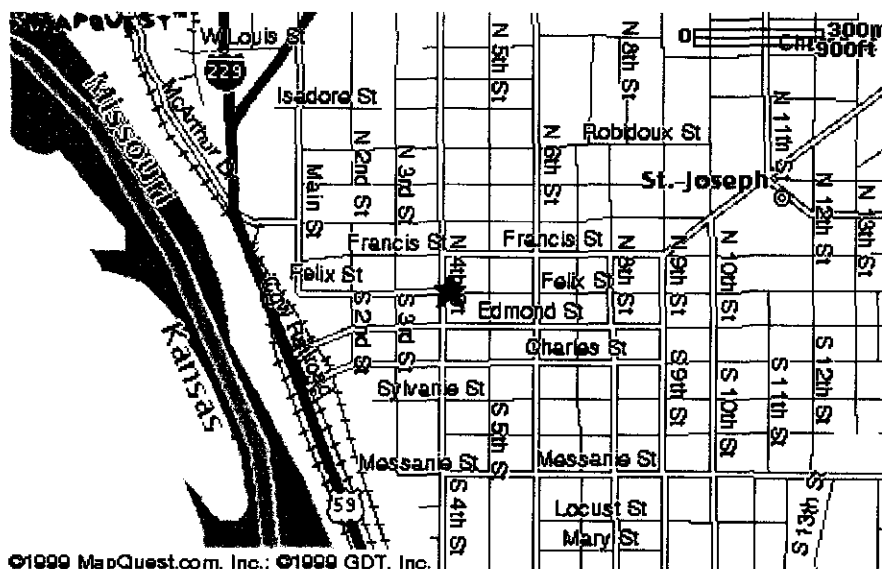

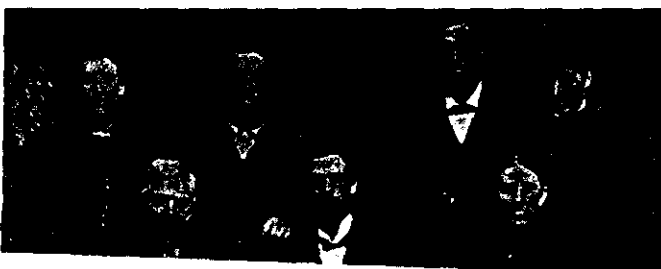

Through her membership she won local, district, and state first place and first prize in sewing and crafts. At age 17, she returned to the Gallatin High School as a Junior. During her Junior year, she entered and won second prize in the United States Essay contest, "How I Would Spend a Thousand Dollars". She was among the 10,000 contestants who entered this essay. Her winning second place was \$250.00. The following year, Patricia graduated as Valedictorian of the class of 1953. As Valedictorian, she was awarded Curators Award Scholarship.
