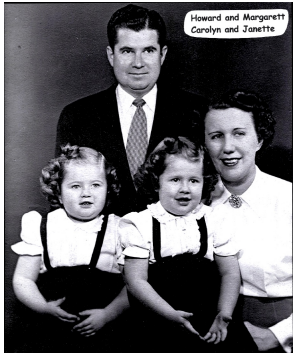


## Margarett F. Carney
