your entry fees are paid."

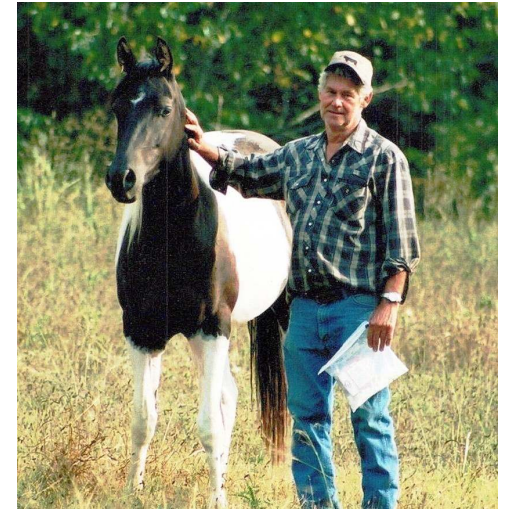
