In memory of the late Jno. W. Cohea, a son of one of the early pioneers:

Mr. Cohea was born April 1st, 1847, and departed this life Sept. 12, 1916. On August 19th, 1869 he was married to Miss Susan R. Cherry. To this union were born eleven children of whom eight survive him, six boys and two girls who have grown to manhood and womanhood and are now among our most prosperous and respected citizens. All were present at the death.

Mr. Cohea was one of our most progressive farmers, who stood high in the county and community in which he was reared as being one of the most energetic and prosperous citizens, a kind father and affectionate husband. All who knew him loved him.

He always had an open hand to do his part in the church and to help the poor and needy. No one was ever turned away from his door hungry. He made peace with God when quite a young man but never united with any denomination, however his choice was the Missionary Baptist.

His death bed was a scene that should convert any sinner. He had no fear of death and as the last breath of life passed out of his body he calmly sang "When the Roll is Called Up Yonder I'll be There."

Oh how sad to give him up. A place is vacant in his home that can never be filled, but the Lord doeth all things well.

His funeral services were conducted by Rev. J. F. Parker assisted by other brethren.
