

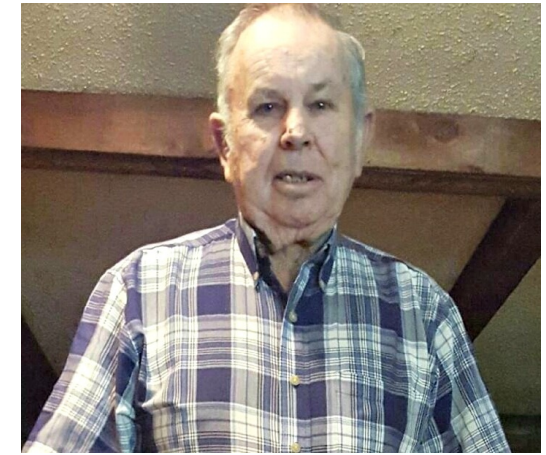
Jimmy Dale Ford
