Lincoln, Ark., Nov. 20-(Special)-Funeral services for John Z. Williamson, 70, who died Sunday at his home in Morrow, were

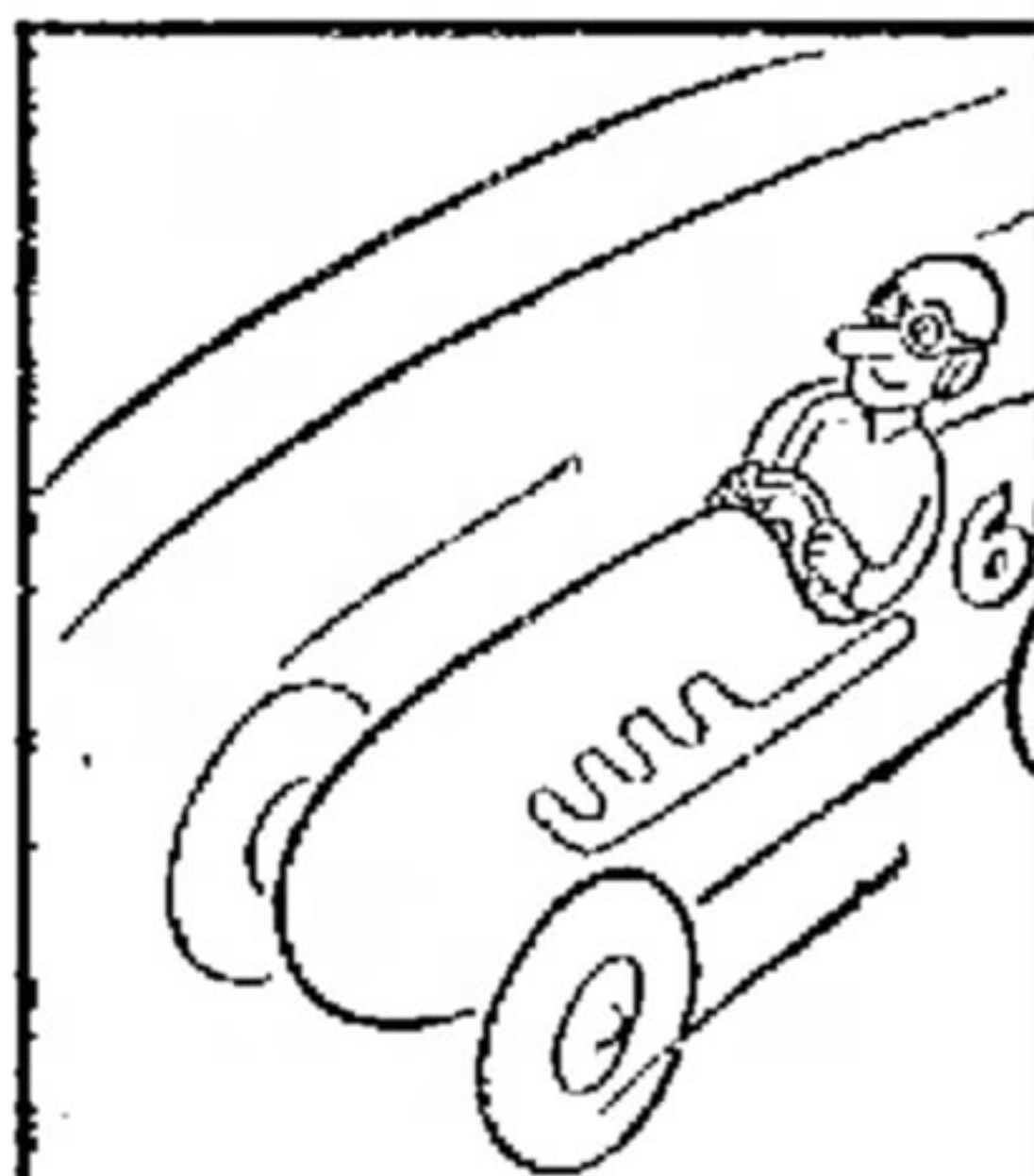
