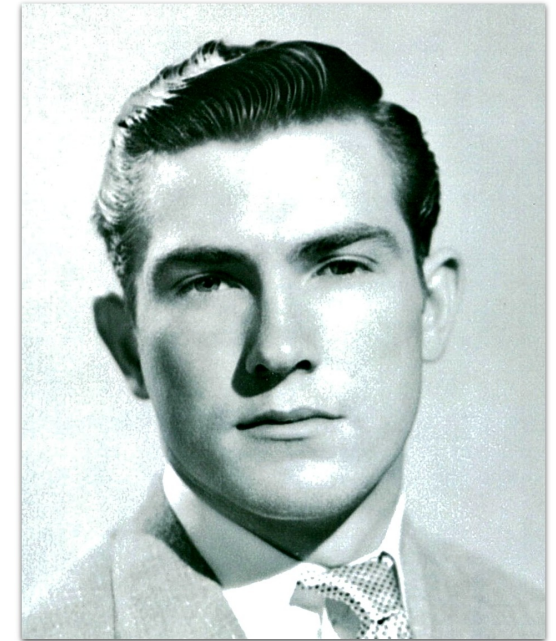


Sonny Lankford
