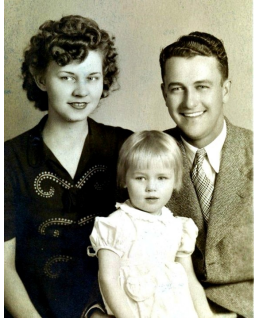


Carol Lee McGarity



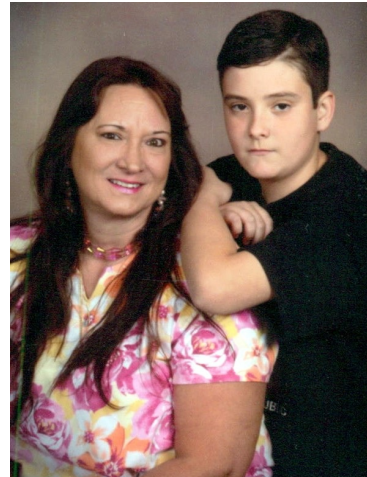
