Born in Minnesota, she grew up (the youngest of three girls) in Council Bluffs, Iowa, where she graduated from High School before making her way to California near her sister Dorothy. She worked in factories most of her career, starting with WWII in an airplane factory. After the war she helped make camping trailers, radio parts and electrical parts. She also did typing and filing, soldering, punching & pressing, waitressing and was a telephone operator.
