Bob left this world on November 23, 2015. He was born July 13, 1927 in Duncan, Oklahoma to Alfred E. and Mary Coleman Mileur. Here Bob finished grade and high school, worked in the local bank, and married his high-school sweetheart Verona Belle Kidd.

After daughter Sharon was born, Bob and Belle moved to Oklahoma City. Both worked in banks initially, then Bob began a successful career with the Air Force at Tinker. He had a 31 year career in a variety of

management positions including Deputy System Manager for the A7D aircraft, was the first AWACS employee in the ALC, and later the first Deputy System Manager for AWACS. He retired as Deputy Director, Supply and Transportation. During his time at Tinker, Bob earned a bachelor's degree at Oklahoma University.

While at Tinker the family lived in Midwest City where son Ron was born. After retiring from Tinker, bob Founded AIREP Corporation - an Aerospace consulting and representative firm. He was CEO of this firm until "real" retirement.
