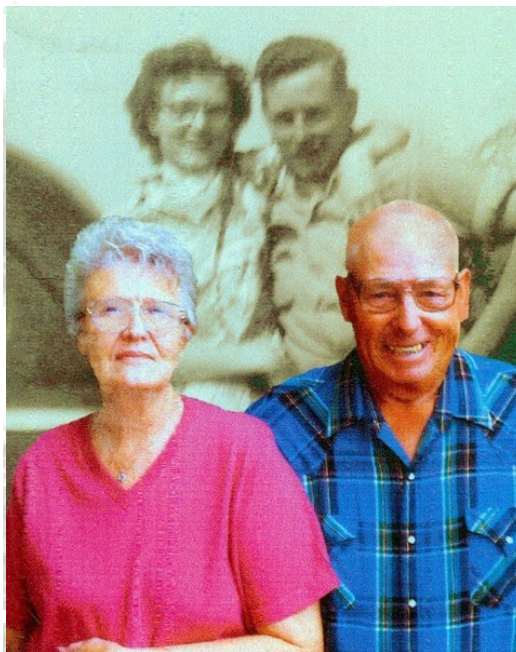


Floyd James Nash


