

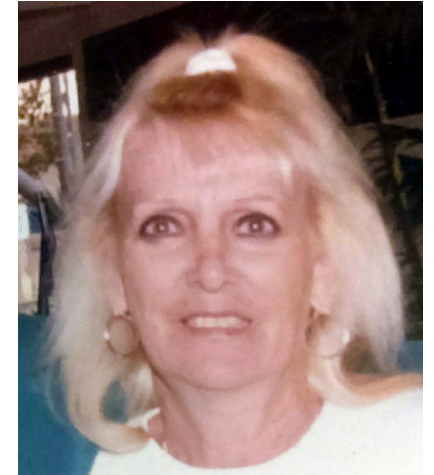
Judy Mae Nichols
