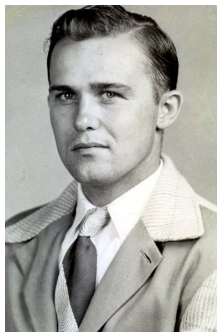


Charles Nolan Oxford
