

David Robert Peck



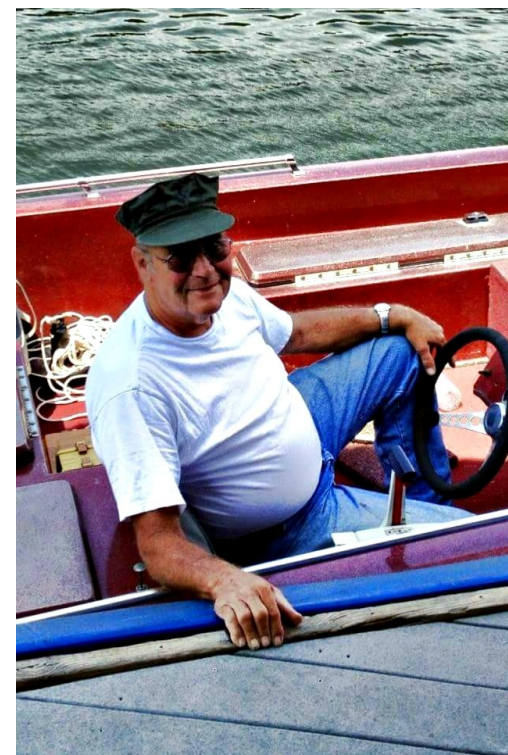
