of the LORD forever.

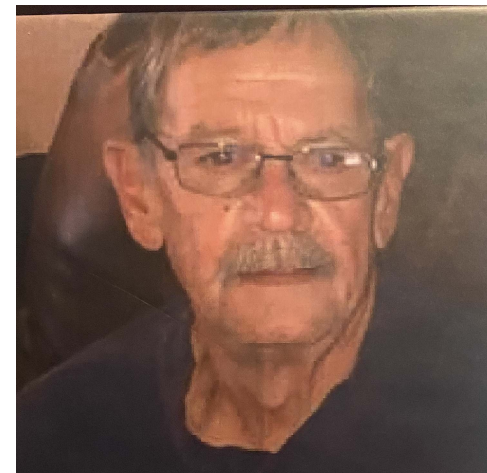
