He was a well-known houndsman, featured in UKC Magazine, and a proud member of the BBCHA Bluetick Breakers and Coon Hunters Association. Rex bred and trained many Champion and Grand Nite Champion dogs, and many Blueticks being hunted today trace back to Rex's own line of dogs.

Rex also had a few habits that were uniquely his. He always carried thirty-two cents and his Uncle Henry pocketknife in his pocket. He never missed an episode of *Gunsmoke*, and he was a devoted Razorback fan. Rex loved to make people laugh and would give you his last dollar or the shirt off his back.

Rex is survived by his loving wife of 64 years, Gloria (Ledbetter) Qualls; daughter Sherri Qualls Elam, of the home; son Shannon Rex Qualls of Fort Smith, Arkansas; one grandson, Aaron Elam; and one great-grandson, Miles Thomas Elam of Springfield, Missouri. He is also survived by three sisters, NoraLee Peters (Jerry), Lois Alderson (Cecil Wayne), and Phyllis Jane Langford, along with numerous nieces, nephews, and extended family members.
