John accepted Jesus Christ as his personal Savior on April 1, 1973.

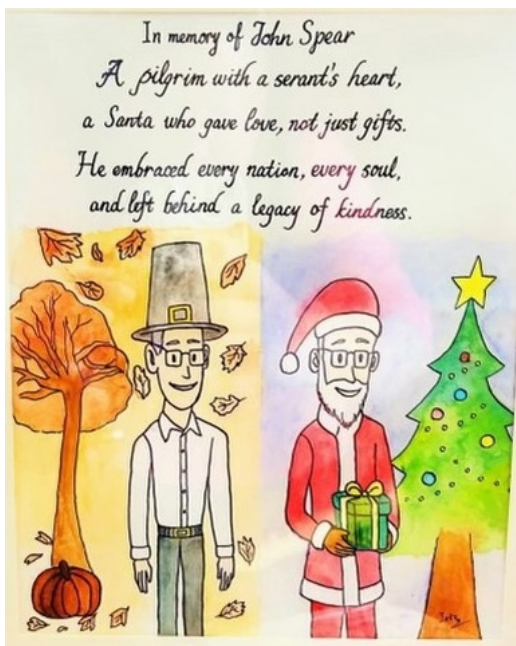
John was known for his cake decorating skills, helping his friends, doing skits with his dummy, Danny O' Day and being a big time Snoopy fan.

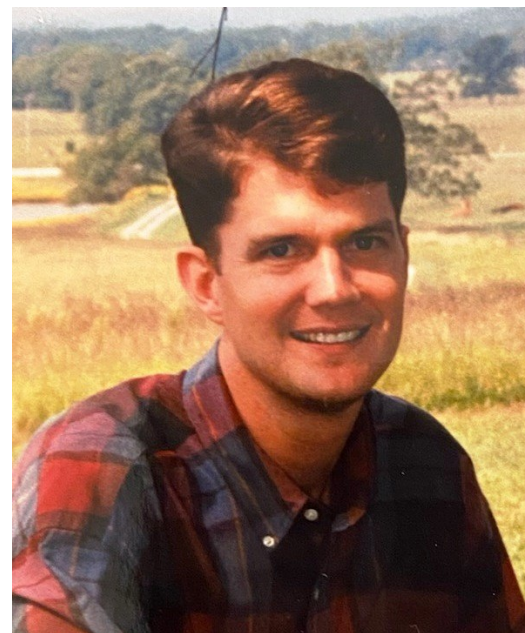
