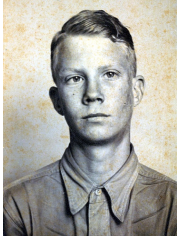


Homer Lee Tate



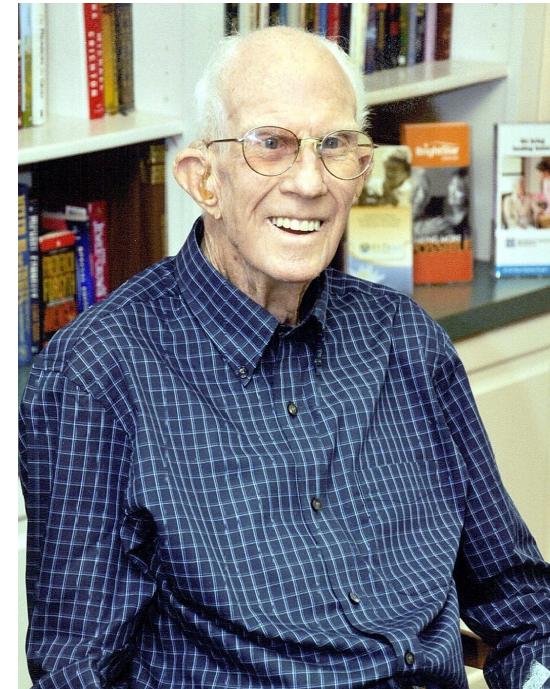
