

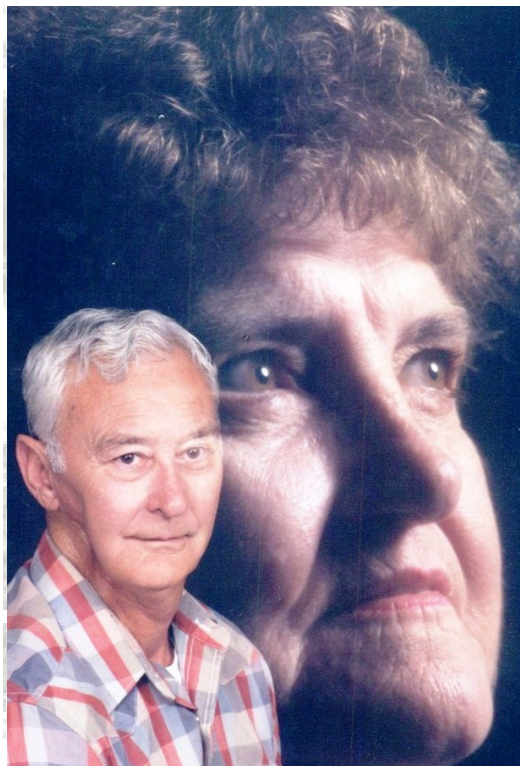
Frances Ilene Taylor
