His name's sake.

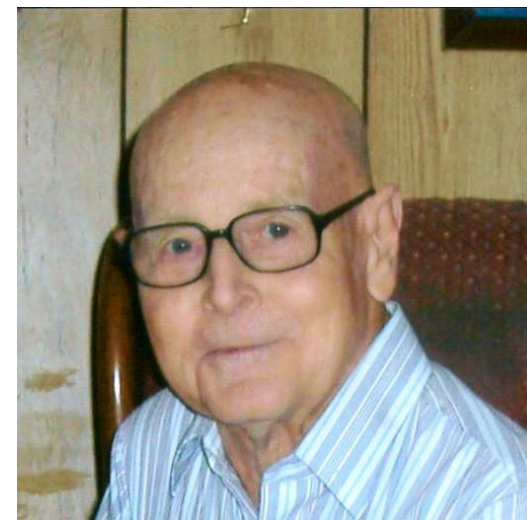
Yea, though I walk through the
