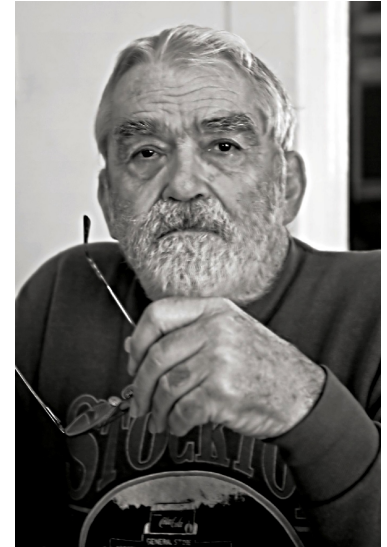
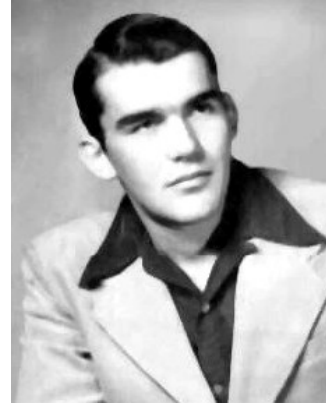

Jacob Frederick Von Canon
