She was preceded in death by her husband Bobby Earl Williams, her parents, one brother Floyd Cantrell, and one niece Connie Cantrell.

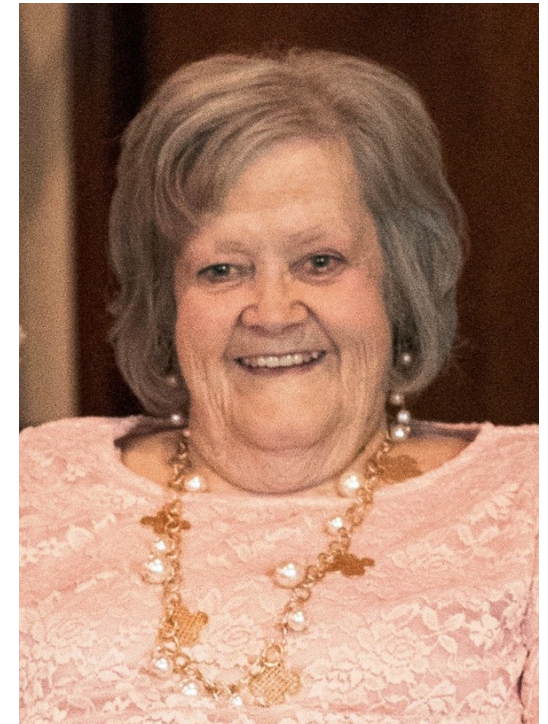
