

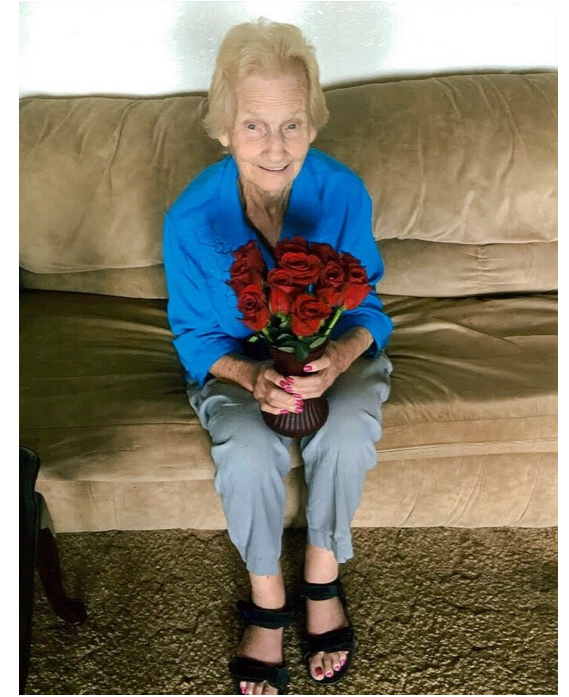
Norma Wright
